- tz = taza
- c. = cucharadita
- C. = cucharada
- c/u = cada uno

4. Additional useful vocabulary:

- Calentar (e->ie): To heat up
- Precalentar (e->ie): To preheat
- Mezclar: to mix
- Revolver: to stir
- Bajar el fuego: to lower the heat
- Subir el fuego: to increase the heat
- Voltear: turn or flip
- La mezcla: the mix
- $\frac{1}{2}$ = Un medio
- $\frac{1}{2}$ Cup = Media taza
- $\frac{1}{4}$ = Un cuarto
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup = Cuarta taza
- $\frac{3}{4}$ = Tres cuartos
- $\frac{1}{3}$ = Un tercio
